To be judged under Sport Horse Society Rules.

Competitors will be given a time to warm up and compete. They will undertake their jumping round, their show and any other elements the judges wishes to see will be completed prior to leaving the ring. Competitors will not return to the ring for line up or presentation. Results will be announced and rosettes given at secretaries caravan.

<u>Class 6a</u> – Kim Burns Equestrian – Working Hunter Nursery Stakes – 15.0hh and under. Fences not to exceed 60 cm. Section A for those 15 years and under on 1.1.21.

<u>Class 6b</u> – **Kim Burns Equestrian** - Working Hunter Nursery Stakes – 15.0hh and under. Fences not to exceed 60 cm. Section B for those 16 years and over 1.1.21.

The two sections will be run concurrently

The highest placed Mountain and Moorland in this class will receive a special rosette

<u>Class 7</u> – Signature Bathrooms - Novice Working Hunter Pony not exceeding 15.0 hh. Fences not to exceed 75cm The highest placed Mountain and Moorland in this class will receive a special rosette

<u>Class 8</u> – North West Equine Vets - Novice Working Hunter Horse exceeding 15.0 hh. Fences not to exceed 75cm

Classes 7 and 8 will be run concurrently.



<u>Class 9</u> –Intermediate Working Hunter Pony not exceeding 15.0 hh. Fences not to exceed 85cm

<u>Class 10</u> – Intermediate Working Hunter Horse exceeding 15.0 hh. Fences not to exceed 85cm

Classes 9 and 10 will be run concurrently.

<u>Class 11</u> – Open Working Hunter Pony exceeding not exceeding 15.0 hh. Fences not to exceed 95cm.

<u>Class 12</u> – Open Working Hunter Horse exceeding 15.0 hh. Fences not to exceed 95cm

Classes 11 and 12 will be run concurrently

Please note: Fence heights are a guide and a maximum. Actual heights at the discretion of the judge on the day.

Warm up jump heights will not exceed the height of the class being jumped by more than 5 cm.

Showing Ring Two

Commences 9:30 am

Entry fee: Full Fee £13.50 Members Fee £8.50

Tack will be at the discretion of the judge and steward, just check before you go in. Double Bridles are not compulsory.

Competitors will be given a time for the class to start. If larger numbers wish to undertake the class, competitors may be split into groups to compete with the judge then making an overall judgement and competitors will not return to the ring for line up or presentation.

In-Hand Classes

Note – any junior handlers for In-hand classes must be overseen by an adult and for classes 28 – 30 the horse must be shown in a bridle. No Junior handlers allowed for Young Stock Classes.

<u>Class 27</u> – In-hand Young Stock – up to three years of age, only foals and yearlings can be entire.

Class 28 – In Hand Veteran aged 15 years and over

<u>Class 29</u> – In-Hand Open Showing – Native / Cob / Traditional.

<u>**Class 13**</u> – Junior Beginner - Pony 14. 2 hh and under and riders 17 years and under on 1.01.21 Fences not to exceed 50cm (Pony not to have had **ANY** BSJA points). All fences will be cross poles.

<u>Class 14</u> – Junior Minimus – Pony 14.2hh and under and riders 17 years and under on 1.01.21. Fences not to exceed 60 cm. (Pony not to have won more than 20 BSJA points).

<u>Class 20</u> – Senior Beginner – Horses with no BSJA winnings. Fences will not exceed 60 cm and fillers will be out (aimed at novice horses and riders).

Classes 14 and 20 will be run concurrently

<u>Class 15 – Junior W G Todd & Sons Novice Show Jumper of the Year</u>. Pony 14.2hh and under and rider 17 years and under on 01.01.21. Pony not to have won more than 75 BSJA points. Fences not to exceed 70cm in the first round.

<u>Class 21</u> – **ukBATHROOMS** - Senior Minimus – Fences will not exceed 70 cm.

Classes 15 and 21 will be run concurrently

<u>Class 16</u> – Junior intermediate - Pony 14.2 hh and under and riders 17 years and under on 1.01.21. Fences not to exceed 80cm



<u>Class 23</u> - **W G Todd & Sons** Novice Show Jumper of the Year. Horses 14.3hh and over and any age rider. Seniors riding ponies 14.2hh and under must compete in the horse section. Horse/pony who has won up to 75 points under BSJA rules. Fences not to exceed 80cms in the first round.

Classes 16 and 23 will be run concurrently

<u>Class 17</u> – Junior Open Show Jumper of the Year – Pony 14.2hh and under and rider 17 years and under on 01.01.21. Fences not to exceed to 90cm.

<u>Class 25</u> – Pre Open Show Jumping. Horses 14.3hh and over and any age rider. Seniors riding ponies 14.2hh and under must compete in the horse section. Fences not to exceed 90cm in the first round.

Classes 17 and 25 will be run concurrently

<u>Class 18</u> – Junior Advanced - Pony 14.2hh and under, rider 17 years and under on 1.01.21. Fences will not exceed 100 cm.

<u>Class 26</u> –Open Show Jumper of the Year (Horse). Horses 14.3hh and over and any age rider. Seniors riding ponies 14.2hh and under must compete in the horse section. Fences not to exceed 100cm in the first round.

Classes 18 and 26 will be run concurrently

Class 27 – Senior Advanced – Fences up to 110cm.

Warm up jump heights will not exceed the height of the class being jumped by more than 5 cm.

Times are given and will be strictly adhered to. Unfortunately if you miss your time, you miss your class. No refunds will be given. Please present yourself to the collecting ring steward twenty minutes before your Dressage time.

All competitors competing in the Show Jumping phase at Combined Training will be expected to jump their appropriate round NO LATER THAN 20 MINUTES after their last dressage test. Failure to do so, may result in elimination from the Combined phase.

Introductory Class

<u>**Class 1</u></u> Introductory Dressage** – BD Introductory Test C (2016). Open to riders of any age. Horses not to be competed above Novice Prelim level on the same day as undertaking this class. Sponsored by -***Net**</u>

Preliminary Classes

<u>Class 2a</u> – **Dressage Only Novice Prelim** (horse or rider) Prelim 12 (revised 2016). Open to seniors 18yrs and over on 1.01.21.

<u>Class 2b</u> – **Dressage Only Novice Prelim** (pony or rider) Prelim 12 (revised 2016). Open to juniors 17 yrs and under on 1.01.21.

<u>Class 2c</u> – Combined Training Novice Prelim (horse or rider) Prelim 12 (revised 2016). Open to seniors 18yrs and over on 1.01.21. Combined Training Jump max height – 70 cm.

<u>Class 2d</u> – Combined Training Novice Prelim (pony or rider) Prelim 12 (revised 2016). Open to Junior 17yrs and over under 1.01.21. Combined Training Jump max height – 70 cm.

Sections for class 2 will be run together

<u>Class 3a</u> – **Dressage only Open Prelim** (short arena) Prelim 14 (revised 2016). Open to seniors 18yrs and over on 1.01.21.

<u>Class 3b</u> – **Dressage only Open Prelim** (short arena) Prelim 14 (revised 2016). Open to juniors 17 yrs and under on 1.01.21.

<u>Class 3c</u> –Combined Training Open Prelim (short arena) Prelim 14 (revised 2016). Open to seniors 18ys and over on 1.01.21. Fences not to exceed 70 cm.

<u>Class 3d</u> –Combined Training Open Prelim (short arena) Prelim 14 (revised 2016). Open to juniors 17 yrs and under on 1.01.21. Fences not to exceed 70 cm.



Sections for class 3 will be run together

<u>Class 4a</u> – **Dressage Only Open Prelim** (long arena) Prelim 19 (revised 2016) Open to juniors and seniors, there will be no separate sections.

<u>Class 4b</u> – Combined Training Open Prelim (long arena) Prelim 19 (revised 2016) Open to juniors and seniors, there will be no separate sections. Combined Training Jump max height – 70 cm –

Novice Section

<u>Class 5a</u> – **Dressage only Novice** (short arena) Novice 28 (2008) Open to seniors 18yrs and over on 1.01.21.

<u>Class 5b</u> – **Dressage only Novice** (short arena) Novice 28 (2008) Open to juniors 17 yrs and under on 1.01.21.

<u>Class 5c</u> – Combined Training Novice (short arena) Novice 28 (2008) Open to seniors 18yrs and over on 1.01.21. Combined Training Jump max height – 80 cm.

<u>Class 5d</u> – Combined Training Novice (short arena) Novice 28 (2008) Open to juniors 17 yrs and under on 1.01.21. Combined Training Jump max height – 80 cm

Sections for class 5 will be run together

<u>Class 6a</u> – **Dressage only Open Novice** (Long arena) Novice 38 (2005). Open to juniors and seniors. With no separate sections

<u>Class 6b</u> – **Combined Training Open Novice** (Long arena) Novice 38 (2005). Open to juniors and seniors. Combined Training Jump max height – 80 cm With no separate sections.

Elementary Section

<u>Class 7a</u> – **Dressage only Elementary –** (Long Arena) Elementary40 (2010). Open to juniors and seniors. With no separate sections.

<u>Class 7b</u> – **Dressage only Elementary –** (Long Arena) Elementary40 (2010). Combined Training Jump max height – 80 cm.



Arenas

These arenas will be used for the first event of the season – changes may be made following that if entries require it:

- Arena 1 (long / short) Classes 4, 6, 7 and 5.
- Arena 2 (short) Classes 1, 2, 3

Readers can be used for any test under the following rules:

- Riders will supply their own reader; the club will not provide one on the day.
- Reading of the test only is allowed, training as part of the test is not allowed in the competition, if the judge feels this is the case at their discretion they can award more penalties or can eliminate the competitor from the class.

Fence heights are an indication only and will be progressive during the season. Due to running three tracks simultaneously there will be some flexibility in the heights of the fences, at the judges' discretion.

Clear round will be available in the jumping ring at the discretion of the steward, but please note that jumps are to stay at the height set for the class in progress. Entry fee £2.00, payable at ring entrance.

Combined training competitors may only jump "clear rounds" **after** they have jumped their class round. Contravention of this rule will result in elimination from the combined training class.

Lakes Riding Club - Points Competition Rules

Points will be awarded to members only. Members must compete in the class to be awarded points. No points will be given for HC riders.

Points are awarded depending on how many are in the class (including nonmembers). For classes with full entries i.e. 6 or more the points are awarded as follows:

- $1^{st} 7$ points
- 2nd 6 points
- 3rd 5 points
- 4th 4 points
- $5^{\text{th}} 3$ points
- 6th 2 points

All other competitors in the class who were not placed, will be given an attendance point (1 point).

If there are a number of non-members competing the awarding of points would be a follows:

- 1st 7 points member points awarded as per first place
- 2nd 6 points Non-member these 6 points will not be awarded
- 3rd 5 points member points awarded as per 3rd place.
- 4th 4 points non-member these 4 points will not be awarded
- 5th 3 points member points awarded as per 5^{th} place.
- 6th 2 points member points awarded as per 6th place.

If the class is not full, the full allocation of points cannot be given and then points will be awarded in relation to the number in the class eg 4 in the class (points awarded by taking the number in the class and adding 1 point):

- 1st 5 points
- $2^{nd} 4$ points
- 3rd 3 points
- 4th 2 points

If non-members are in a class with fewer numbers the same awarding will apply as in the previous example.

If there is a tie for a place then the points for that place and the place below will be shared:

- 1st 7 points winner awarded 7 points
- =2nd 6 points) 6 and 5 points for 2^{nd} and 3rd place added and
- =2nd 5 points) divided so each competitor is awarded 5.5 points.
- 4th 4 points 4th placed competitor awarded 4 points
- 5th 3 points 5th placed competitor awarded 3 points
- 6th 2 points 6th placed competitor awarded 2 points.



In order to win the trophy a competitor should have competed in the class at least twice during the year, (unless the class has only been run once ie there are no competitors for 3 shows). As such it is possible for a competitor to win the trophy with fewer points than someone who has only attended one show but won a class with more than 6 competitors on that day. This is most likely in the event of poor weather during the season when a number of shows are cancelled.

If no competitor has competed in more than one class over the season, then the trophy can be awarded to the competitor(s) with the most points at the committees discretion.

Calculation of Champions

- For individual classes the champion will be the single horse and rider combination with the highest number of points.
- For overall champions (senior, junior, dressage, showing) these are awarded to the rider with the most points and will be calculated by adding all the points accumulated over the discipline(s) competed in during the season on all horses / ponies.

Upgrading Rule – for relevant classes in the following sections upgrading will be considered by the committee for anyone who has achieved 27 points or more:

Working Hunter – Nursery Stakes and Novice Classes Showjumping – Beginner and minimus classes Dressage / Combined Training – Introductory and Prelim Classes.

Competition Rules

"Riding can be a high risk sport. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers' or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any Lakes Riding Club event nor any agent, judge or representative accepts any liability for any loss, damage to property, accident, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators or any other person, how so ever caused."

Only Affiliated Riding Club members (adults or children) are covered by BRC Insurance. Nonmembers are strongly advised that they are personally liable for any accident or injury suffered or caused by themselves, their horses or any of their associates.

Competitors please note:

Entries

- a) All entries must be paid for at the time of entry. No refunds are given but alternative classes can be entered.
- b) Clear Round Jumping will take place as described in the schedule and must be paid for at the ring side.
- c) Non-Competitive rounds will be allowed in all rings. Ponies may jump non-competitively at their appropriate, or lower, height limit. Horses MAY NOT jump non- competitively in pony classes. Having jumped non competitively in a ring, that horse/pony MUST remain noncompetitive in that ring all day.
- d) A horse/pony may only be entered once in a particular class. A rider can ride more than one horse/pony per class.

Dress and Tack

- e) Spurs allowed for junior members for showjumping and dressage only after agreement of welfare officer.
- Hard hats and correct dress must be worn at all events. Hats to the correct BHS/BRC f) standard to be worn with chin-straps fastened at all times when mounted (for details of BRC hat standards see the website). (Body Protectors advised).
- g) Gaiters may be worn providing they are of identical leather to the boot and have no decoration of any sort. Half Chaps are not permitted.
- h) Snaffle bridles in equitation classes. No martingales, boots or bandages.
- i) Dressage tack rules Snaffle bridles for Prelim and Novice classes. Double bridles may be used in Elementary or Medium classes. NO boots, bandages or martingales in any dressage class. See BD rule book for permitted snaffle bits. Please note - Wilkie Snaffles are NOT permitted bits. Bits may be changed for the jumping phase of Combined Training.
- Training aids cannot be used in the warm up phase. i)
- k) Tack for Showing classes will be at the discretion of the judge and steward.
- I) Handlers of in-hand showing are advised to wear hard hats anyone not doing, do so at their own risk.
- m) All other dress, tack and equipment follows the BRC rules.
- n) Only at the discretion of the committee can allowance be made regarding the removal of jackets in hot weather.

General rules

- o) NEW COMBINATIONS Riders, especially juniors who have purchased any horse/pony that is disqualified from our novice classes, due to its previous competition history, may for their first season as a combination, compete in the novice classes.
- p) No outside assistance in any class.
- q) BD rules apply in dressage and combined training competition
 r) BS rules, except age-to-height limits, apply in show jumping classes.
- s) Riders and/or their associates are not permitted to alter fences in any ring without permission from a steward.
- t) No lungeing on the show field without permission from the event secretary.
- u) Horses should not be left unattended if tied to the side of trailers or vehicles in the lorry park.
- v) Anyone wishing to ride or handle stallions must seek individual permission from the committee.
- w) No refunds will be given for classes entered and not competed in.
- x) The committee reserve the right to alter these rules at any time.
- y) The committee reserve the right to disqualify any competitor who contravenes these rules.
